

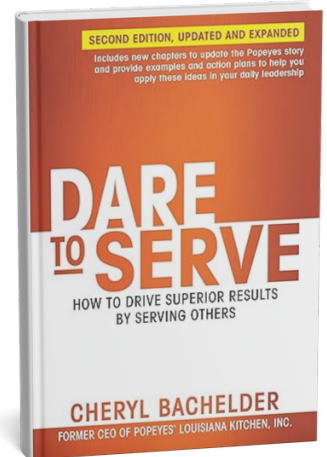

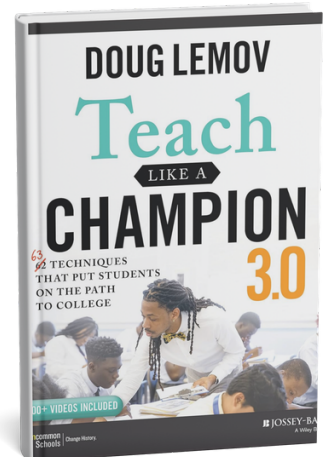

A practical guide packed with proven strategies that help teachers motivate and lead their students to excellence.



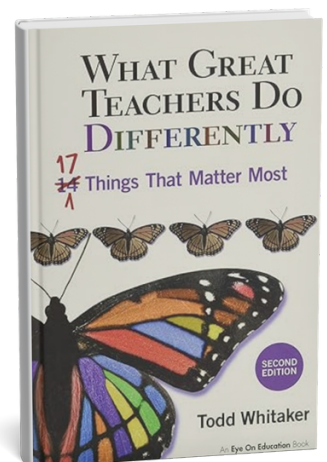

Explores how neuroscience can inform effective teaching strategies. This focus on maximizing student capacity (Growth) and optimizing instruction supports high professional Performance.



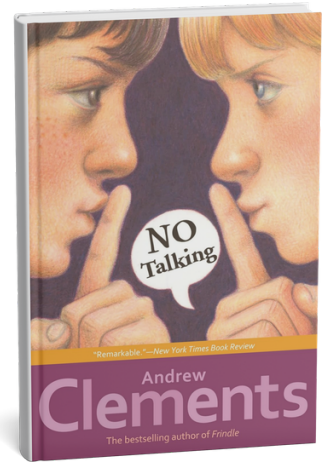
